Rural revamp: UP govt's ₹2.15 lakh crore proposal for mission 2031

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A comprehensive rural development initiative has been rolled out in Uttar Pradesh under the banner of Mission 2031. With a long-term focus on infrastructure and service improvements in villages, the initiative aims to reshape the rural landscape of the state over the next five years.

A proposal amounting to 2.15 lakh crore has been submitted to the Central Finance Commission, seeking financial support for rural local bodies. This includes 1.74 lakh crore earmarked for gram panchayats, ₹17,334 crore for block-level development, and 22,940 crore for district pan-

22,940 crore for district panchayats. The funds are designated for upgrading essential infrastructure such as roads, drainage, electricity, and drinking water systems.

Though the official schedule is awaited, elections are anticipated in April-May next year. The Panchayati Raj Department has begun delimitation and reservation processes, and objections to proposed ward boundaries will be accepted from July 4–8. The final ward list is expected between July 12–14, followed by updates to the voter rolls.
