## Chief secretary for simplifying forms to improve experience of investors

Lucknow: Uttar Pradesh chief secretary Manoj Kumar Singh on Wednesday chaired a review meeting aimed at streamlining and enhancing the Ease of Doing Business in the state, in the presence of National Commission for Backward Classes (NCBC) secretary Meeta Rajivlochan.

During the meeting, additional CEO of Invest UP, Shashank Chaudhary, presented a focused plan covering 23 priority areas across departments such as Housing and Urban Planning, Labour, the Uttar Pradesh Pollution Control Board (UPPCB), Uttar Pradesh Power Corporation Limited (UPPCL), the Fire Department, Board of Revenue, and Invest UP. The plan also includes 71 sub-priority areas, demonstrating the state's commitment to fostering a more business-friendly environment.

Additional secretary, Cabinet Secretariat, Rahul Sharma, along with senior officials from the Department for Promotion of Industry and Internal Trade (DPIIT) and NITI Aayog, were also present on the occasion.
