Among the standout features of the fair was the participation of women and rural girls trained by institutions like RSWM Pvt. Ltd. and Shri Siddhi Vinayak Education Society. Ayushi Nigam of

RSWM explained that girls from rural backgrounds are offered free training in IT and soft skills, along with meals, lodging, and healthcare. Their creations including potli bags, cushion covers, jute crafts, and wall hangings were showcased at the event, promoting both self-reliance and sustainability. Trainer Shivani Singh highlighted how three-month residential courses are leading to employment in private hospitals and companies, particularly in cities like Noida. Graduates of these programs are also beginning to start small ventures of their own.

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
