'UP now known for creating jobs'

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Youths are a reservoir of immense energy. Villages in UP have witnessed mass migration in the past. But now our state is known for generating employment. We will make sure that every youth in the state has a secure job," Yogi assured the large number of youths who gathered to listen to him.

Pointing out successful schemes such as One District One Product, Yogi said that traditional industries and crafts are providing immense opportunities to rural households and have given the state a global identity. Presently, 96 lakh MSME units are active in the state, and 40 lakh migrant workers who returned to their villages during the pandemic have been absorbed into the manufacturing industry, he said. An insurance cover of Rs 5 lakh is being provided for entrepreneurs operating the MSMEs. The Prime Minister's Vocal for Local and Atmanirbhar Bharat initiatives have bolstered local products, echoed Yogi. Traditional workers such as carpenters, masons, blacksmiths, goldsmiths, potters, cobblers, and barbers have been provided toolkits and affordable loans along with specialised training to scale up their operations. "We launched the CM Yuva Udyami scheme in Jan under which interest-free loans are being offered to youths between 21 and 40. So far, 70,000 youths have already derived the benefits under the scheme. UP witnessed investments exceeding Rs 15 lakh crore, which created jobs for 60 lakh youths," the CM said.

Moreover, 8.50 lakh youths have been provided jobs with complete transparency, with the majority of jobs created in the police, education, health, and agriculture departments, he added. Taking a leap, support from Tata Technologies is being taken to train youth in the latest

15 get job letters, 1,800 recruited in a day

Lucknow: Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath gave away appointment letters to 15 candidates selected by companies from UAE and other countries. During the Rojgar Mahakumbh, 11 companies gave the highest number of assurances for appointments. This year, the initiative witnessed over 1,00,000 registrations, offering 50,000 job opportunities and 15,000 international vacancies, including placements in the UAE, Saudi Arabia, Japan, and Germany. In addition, 35,000 domestic opportunities will be provided through leading Indian companies. The three-day employment fair features participation from over 100 recruitment partners, including 20 international recruiters. More than 10,000 offer letters will be distributed, with over 2,000 dedicated to overseas placements. A total 1,818 candidates out of 5,200 interviewed on Tuesday were recruited. The break up was: white collar jobs: 468 (salary Rs 30,000-35,000 per month); blue collar jobs: 900 (Rs 12,000-17,000 per month) and international jobs: 450 (for UAE) with Rs 30,000-45,000 per month. Lucknow: Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath will hand over appointment letters to 2,425 newly selected chief assistants and 13 pharmacists in the child development and nutrition department under Mission Rozgar on Wednesday.

A govt spokesman said the event will mark the largest recruitment in the department in the past two decades.

Director of the department Sarnit Kaur Broca said: "Candidates were selected by the Uttar Pradesh Subordinate Services Selection Commission through a transparent process. The CM will personally distribute appointment letters to the candidates, which will not only strengthen the anganwadi system but also energise women and child development services."

She added that the ministers Baby Rani Maurya and Pratibha Shukla will also be present at the event. Broca said over the past eight years, the department has recorded remarkable achievements. "Promotions were completed through the Public Service Commission for six district programme officer positions and over 200 child development project officer positions. Recruitment of 19,424 anganwadi workers was completed across 75 districts while over 3,000 assistants were promoted to worker positions," she said. She also said the honorarium for 22,290 mini anganwadi workers converted to main workers was increased from Rs 5,500 to Rs 8,000. "Two years ago, 320 honorarium workers were absorbed into regular service, marking a significant achievement," she said. Broca also noted that the department set an example in promotions and compassionate appointments.
