
UP leads in drafting 'Viksit Rajya for Viksit Bharat' plan

Lucknow: Uttar Pradesh is among the first states to have formulated a strategy to prepare its plan for 'Viksit Rajya for Viksit Bharat 2047', aligned with the vision of a Viksit Bharat-2047, as discussed at a Governing Council meeting of the NITI Aayog chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi in May this year.

Urging people to participate in the campaign, the CM called upon them to give their suggestions "for building a strong, self-reliant, and prosperous new Uttar Pradesh". He also shared the link of the Samarth UP portal on which people can learn about Viksit UP-2047 initiative and provide suggestions.

On Sept 3, the CM launched a QR code that allows citizens to access the Viksit UP 2047 portal, read about its plans, and share feedback. A team of over 400 intellectuals, including retired bureaucrats, engineers, and professors, has been dispatched across the state to engage with social groups and gather in-

puts for the vision document.

Several other initiatives undertaken by the UP govt to boost the state's economy and position it as India's growth engine have earned praise from other states. One such initiative, the District Domestic Product (DDP) plan, which maps district-wise GDP to track development and contributions to the state econo-

my, has been widely acknowledged as an important monitoring tool. Delegations from Madhya Pradesh, Assam, and Rajasthan have already visited UP to study this model.

According to a government spokesperson, Maharashtra and Tamil Nadu have also expressed interest in visiting the state for the same purpose.
