UP Vision 2047 Targets Growth, Innovation

Uttar Pradesh has begun drafting its long-term development roadmap with the preparation of "Samarth Uttar Pradesh – Viksit Uttar Pradesh @2047", a vision document aimed at transforming the state into a developed economy by 2047. A one-day orientation workshop was held at Lok Bhavan, where Principal Secretary (Planning) Alok Kumar presented a detailed blueprint.

The vision document is designed around three pillars—economic strength, inno-



vation, and vitality—and will emphasize 12 priority sectors. These include agriculture, livestock conservation, industrial development, IT and emerging technologies, tourism, urban and rural development, infrastructure, balanced regional growth, social welfare, health,

education, and security with governance. Uttar Pradesh's contribution is targeted at expanding its economy to \$6 trillion by 2047, aligned with the national growth framework. As part of the process, nearly 400 intellectuals will visit districts across the state

on September 8–9. They will engage with students, farmers, entrepreneurs, teachers, voluntary organisations, and citizens to gather feedback for incorporation into the final document. The campaign will extend to every village, with seminars planned at the Gram Panchayat level to ensure grassroots participation.

Vision based on 12 key sectors, from agriculture to tourism

To make the consultation

process accessible, a feedback portal has been launched where citizens can submit suggestions by scanning a QR code. The state aims to collect at least one feedback entry from every household. Inputs from farmers, women, small industries, and traders will receive special focus, alongside contributions from subject experts, NITI Aayog, and industry leaders.

The campaign will run from September 5 to October 5 and will be publicised through hoardings, newspaper advertisements, radio, television, and social media.
