Lucknow: Senior ministers credited Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath for driving Uttar Pradesh's industrial surge and reshaping the state's economic landscape.

Speaking during GIDA's foundation day function, industrial development minister Nand Gopal Nandi said, "Under CM Yogi Adityanath, UP moved from the darkness of the past to an era of growth. Welfare schemes are reaching the last beneficiary and GIDA is emerging as a model industrial authority."

He claimed that areas neglected by previous govts, including parts of GI-DA, now host major industries generating nearly 50,000 direct and 1.5 lakh indirect jobs, significantly reducing migration from Gorakhpur.
