

12 dedicated teams reviewing 50,000 entries on daily basis

Turning this into a mega public outreach programme, where not just suggestions for works to be done but recognition for the govt's policies and performance over the past eight years are pouring in, the govt hopes to set a record of 1 crore public engagements for the filing of the draft action plan. This may be launched with much fanfare in the coming months, allowing the govt to present it to the citizens in time for the panchayat polls in early 2026 and then the assembly elections in 2027.

Principal secretary, planning department, Alok Kumar,

said the next step after collecting suggestions will be holding stakeholder consultations for each of the 12 sectors under which work has been divided.

He mentioned that through Nov, meetings will be held sec-

tor-wise to discuss the best suggestions received under each, and how those can be implemented practically. This exercise will culminate in the composition of the first draft of the Vision Document for Viksit UP-2047.

As of now, 12 sectoral teams set up by the planning department are manually reviewing

roughly 50,000 entries per day. Each day, they are identifying the best suggestions received from various districts and highlighting the most promising proposals for further detailing. Eventually, Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath will reward the best suggestions at the state level and district level. The teams are also contacting people who have sent in particularly promising suggestions so that they can be developed further and forwarded for shortlisting.

In addition to this, IIT Kanpur is using AI to sort through the suggestions. It is categorising them into 12 different sectors and sorting them under relevant themes.
