

‘Proposed investments aligned with state’s vision’

Another MoU worth Rs 150 crore was signed with Yeoman for defence manufacturing and weapons system integration.

Officials said the proposed investments are aligned with the state’s long-term vision of sustainable development, technology-driven governance and large-scale employment generation, while strengthening its global competitiveness.

The delegation, which included officials from the infrastructure, industry, energy and chief minister’s office, also held business-to-govt meetings with several global and Indian firms, including Louis

Dreyfus Company, Uber Technologies, Automation Anywhere, PepsiCo, HCL Software, Google Cloud, Greenko and Deloitte South Asia.

A key interaction was held with Uber to explore expanded investments, mobility partnerships and the possibility of setting up a global capability centre in Noida. Uber officials highlighted that the company already operates around 1.5 lakh vehicles across more than 13 locations in UP and flagged opportunities in tourism, last-mile connectivity and innovative mobility solutions.

The delegation also met Carbon Compass founder and CEO Neeraj Agarwal to discuss climate innovation and sustainability-led growth.
