

Jewar will become India's greenest airport

Lucknow: The Noida International Airport (Jewar) is set to become not only a major hub for air connectivity but also a model of environmental sustainability. Developed on a net-zero concept in collaboration with Zurich Airport Group, Jewar airport has earned the distinction of being India's first IGBC-certified green campus airport. According to YEIDA ACEO, Shailendra Kumar Bhatia, the terminal building has been designed to minimize energy, water, and waste consumption. About 20% of the parking area will have fast and standard charging stations for electric vehicles, while all airside operational vehicles will be fully electric with multiple charging points across the premises. A solar farm spread over 83 acres is being developed with a capacity of 51,966 megawatt-hours, ensuring large-scale renewable energy supply. TNN
