

UP GDP, per capita income more than doubled in 8 yrs: Eco review

Lucknow: UP's economy has more than doubled from Rs 13.3 lakh crore in 2016-17 to Rs 30.25 lakh crore in 2024-25 while the per capita income has increased from Rs 54,564 to Rs 1,09,844 in past nine years, according to Economic Review of the state for 2025-26, a first-of-its-kind initiative by any state in the country.

According to the review, UP's economy is projected to

reach Rs 36 lakh crore this fiscal. Presenting the first economic review of the state ahead of the Budget, finance minister Suresh Khanna said that in the past nine years, the Budget size has also doubled from Rs 3.47 lakh crore in 2016-17 to Rs 8.33 lakh crore in 2025-26.

"Between 2008-09 and 2016-17, the increase in budget size was Rs 2.34 lakh crore as against Rs 4.86 lakh crore between 2016-17 and 2024-2025," he said. Highlighting salient features of Economic Review, Khanna said, "The total economy of UP has doubled from Rs 13.3 lakh crore in 2016-17 to Rs 30.25 lakh crore in 2024-2025. 'The size of the economy is estimated to touch Rs 36 lakh crore by current fiscal 2025-2026.'"

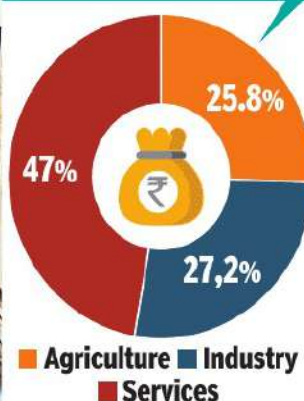
