

# Budget gives direction for UP's rapid devt: Khanna

Finance minister Suresh Khanna welcomed the Budget, saying that it would provide a new direction to the comprehensive, balanced and rapid development of Uttar Pradesh.

The minister said the increase in capital expenditure would accelerate the development of expressways, industrial corridors, logistics hubs, railways and urban infrastructure in the state, which would invite more investment.

"Industrial incentives and MSME support will strengthen small and medium industries in the state, which will increase opportunities for lo-

cal and self-employment. The establishment of a Digital Knowledge Grid will be extremely beneficial for the youth. The decision to promote 15 historical cities to boost tourism and create 10,000 tourist guides, the AI hub, and the decision to spend 40,000 crore on the electronic sector are also welcome," he said.

Khanna pointed out that the Budget has made a provision of Rs 20,000 crore to mitigate climate change and provide relief to cities with poor air quality. High-speed rail corridors, especially Delhi-Varanasi and Varanasi-Siliguri rou-
