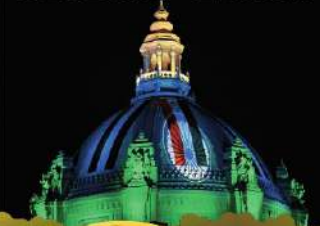


# UP's Economy On Fast-Track



## Economy

- UP's contribution to national economy up from 8.6% in 2016-17 to 9.1% in 2024-25
- Per capita income has doubled from ₹54,564 in 2016-17 to ₹1,09,844 in 2024-25. Estimated to reach ₹1.2 lakh
- On GSDP per capita basis, income up from ₹61,142 in 2016-17 to ₹1,26,304 in 2024-25

## Agriculture & Industry

- Agriculture & allied services contributed 25.8% to UP's economy in 2024-25

- Industry's share at 27.2% and services 47%
- UP ranks first in country in numerical skills with 80.12%

## Law & Order

- Govt promoted tech-driven policing to improve efficiency
- Expanded use of CCTV, digital case management systems and stringent action against criminals have enhanced performance
- Under Safe City project, women police beats & anti-Romeo squads introduced
- Integration of security, health and employment services under

## Mission Shakti

- Minor procedural offences decriminalized through Jan Vishwas Act
- Initiatives made UP safer & investment-friendly state

## Rural Devpt & Employment

- Expenditure on rural development, which stood at ₹10,508 cr in 2017-18, rose to ₹20,081 cr in 2025-26
- Spending on rural development works grew at an annual compound growth rate of 8.43%
- Compared to 1,814.34 lakh

- 'Manav Diwas' in 2017-18, UP generated 3,363.97 lakh 'Manav Diwas' in 2024-25, an increase of 85.41%
- 1500mt stretch of extinct Shahzad river rejuvenated in Lalitpur

- In 2024-25, employment was provided to 75.83 lakh workers from 65.26 lakh families
- Under VB-G Ram G Scheme, 13.54 cr saplings planted in 2024-25 and 13.23 cr in 2025-26

- By Nov 2025, over 19,000 Amrit Sarovars constructed or rejuvenated
- By Oct 2025, 3,550 playgrounds and 1,706

## anganwadi centres constructed

- Women participation under VB-G Ram G Scheme increased from 35% in 2018-19 to 42% in 2024-25

## Education

- Created an extensive network of 2,62,358 schools - 1,35,658 primary, 90,243 upper primary, 11,938 secondary, and 24,519 higher secondary schools
- Male literacy rate was 80.6% and female literacy rate was 62.9% in 2017-18, which increased to 86% and 70.4%, respectively, in 2023-24

- Approx 2.08 times increase recorded in allocation of education in 2025-26 compared to 2017-18
- In 2025-26, free textbooks & workbooks distributed to 1.47 cr children from class 1 to 8
- 87,700 girls are receiving education in all 746 Kasturba Gandhi Vidyalayas
- Samarth portal developed to identify and track online disabled children aged 6-14 years
- In 10 years, number of colleges has increased from 6,681 to 8,030
