

Japan-based Nippon Express looks at States like U.P. for expansion

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Japanese logistics provider The NX Group (Nippon Express Group) is considering expanding in India and is looking at States like Uttar Pradesh, where Japanese parks are also coming up.

“We learn this current movement of government-to-government relationship and this is a very good sign. How we can explore our network, our footprint, according to this movement... we have just started our study. But, definitely this is a good sign, and Uttar Pradesh itself is a huge market. So, I take it very positively and I want to consider,” said Katsuhito Kobayashi, Executive Officer, South Asia & Oceania,

Nippon Express. After Japan, the US, Europe and other parts of Asia, Nippon Express Group is now trying make a “big team in India”, said Kobayashi, especially after the India Semiconductor Mission 2.0.

“We are happy to be part of the ecosystem from a lo-

gistics point of view... we are very much eager to bring our logistics know-how to India,” he said, adding that the company has been in the country for over 20 years with customers like Tata Electronics. He also said the firm would like to set up its logistics facilities in strategic places nearer to semiconductor factories.

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The NX Group and the ISM also signed a memorandum of understanding at the Semicon India 2026, establishing a framework for collaboration to support the development of India’s semiconductor ecosystem.

NXP had a turnover of \$153 million in India, in 2024, and aims to achieve around \$380 million by 2028.
