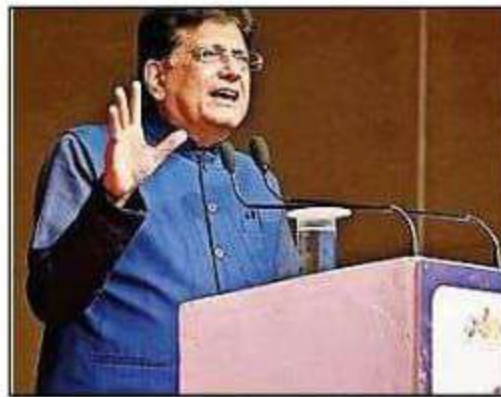


UP's ambitious export target shows its soaring confidence, says Goyal

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Lucknow/Gautam Budh Nagar: Stating that UP's target to increase its annual exports to Rs 5 lakh crore by 2030 speaks for UP's soaring confidence and burgeoning economic capacity, Union minister for commerce and industry Piyush Goyal on Sunday said that the echo of UP's growth can be heard across the globe.

"UP has dramatically transitioned from a legacy of fiscal distress and industrial hesitation into an export-led manufacturing powerhouse. The target of scaling UP's exports to Rs 5 lakh crore by 2030 reflects the state's soaring confidence and burgeoning

economic capacity," Goyal said, adding, "The echo of UP's development is no longer confined within our national boundaries; it is now being heard across the globe."

He was addressing a high-powered business session titled 'Leveraging India's Free Trade Agreements for Global Business Growth' on the third

day of UP International Trade Show (UPITS) at Greater Noida's India Expo Mart.

Citing the rapid emergence of high-tech manufacturing — such as the advanced robotics factory near Noida, the defence industrial corridor, and upcoming semiconductor parks — Goyal noted that UP's industrial landscape has fundamentally transformed.

He pointed out that the strategic synergy between double-engine govt has dismantled prior bottlenecks, positioning local industry to unlock benefits from India's newly inked and expanding Free Trade Agreements (FTAs).
