Lucknow: Projects launched in Bundelkhand during the recent groundbreaking ceremony will bring in around 15,000 jobs in the region. The 681 projects that were grounded are spread over all seven districts of Bundelkhand and will attract investments of Rs68,000 crore. The-

se are largely solar projects and manufacturing units etc.

A govt official said the top 29

projects will bring in investment of Rs 29,000 crore in the seven districts-- Banda, Chitrakoot, Jhansi, Jalaun, Hamirpur, Lalitpur and Mahoba -- and generate employment for over 9,000 people.

Among the major projects, Tesco Ltd will invest Rs 4,700 crore in an 800 MW solar power project in Chitrakoot which will employ 400 people.

Ayodhya, Varanasi & Mathura to attract ₹48K cr investment

Lucknow: Holy towns of UP are going to emerge as employment centres. Yogi Adityanath govt would create opportunities for 14,000 people in Ayodhya, Varanasi and Mathura through investments amounting to Rs 48,000 crore.

Sources in state government said that tourism, hospitality and real estate sectors are going to be key segments which would provide the maximum number of jobs. Through Ground Breaking Ceremony 4.0 commercial, industrial and other crucial projects would take off in the three religious centres of the state in the coming months.

Through the top-15 pro-

jects the government expects to generate 14,000 employment opportunities. Among them 372 projects worth around Rs 1,300 crores are going to come up in Ayodhya.

Abhinandan Lodha House is investing Rs 3,000 crores in the real estate and commercial projects in Ayodhya, whereas PKH Ventures Ltd is going to establish a tourist facilitation centre with Rs 600 crore, wherein construction of a hotel with 500 rooms will absorb 300 individuals in the temple town. Pakka Limited is setting up a paper manufacturing unit with a budget of Rs 550 crore, providing 600 jobs. Similarly, Varanasi, known as the city of Lord Shiva, has witnessed the ground breaking of 277 projects

which would yield Rs 19,250 crore worth investment. The top-5 projects would provide 1,500 to 2,000 jobs. The Bharat Heavy Electricals Ltd (BHEL) is coming up with Rs 500 crore worth research and development facilities. Roma Builders and Promoters would establish an upscale resort which would have a meditation and wellness centre. Gajadhar Technossys would establish a housing project in Kashi.

Mathura, a city which already has substantial industrial units, has managed to attract many more investors. In all, 415 projects worth Rs 16,600 crore have been launched during the recently concluded GBC and would create 11,000 jobs.

wer Ltd will invest Rs 6,000 crore in a 1,200 MW in Jalaun where 300 people will be employed. Sanchay New Age Developers will also set up a 100 MW utility scale solar power park where 100 people will be employed.

A Global Innovation Hub and defence related testing unit are also coming up at a cost of Rs 900 crore where 50 people will get jobs. Bundelkhand Solar Power Ltd will employ 50 people in their 65 MW plant.

In Jhansi, Tesco Ltd is setting up its second solar power plant at an investment of Rs 3,430 crore. This will provide employment for 300 people. RVNLLtd is investing Rs 2,840 crore in a railway LBH coaches project and track works where 1,500 will be employed. Another 1,000 will be employed at a 100 MW Solar power plant being set up by Fourth Partner Energy Pvt Ltd in Babina. Sun Source Energy will generate 500 jobs at its 135 MW solar power project.
