"Several UKbased companies have already established a strong presence in the state, attracted by its favourable investment climate and supportive govt policies," the official said, giving the example of AB Mauri, a subsidiary of British Foods PLC, which is investing Rs 1,100 crore to establish a new yeast manufacturing plant in Pilibhit.

In the biotech sector, Genus Breeding India Pvt Ltd has set up a unit in Lucknow. The defence sector has also seen investments with UK-based Webley & Scott establishing a plant for manufacturing air guns in the Sandila Phase-2 Industrial Area. The plant began operations in June 2020. FMCG giant Unilever is operating a unit in Hamirpur, while chemical company Johnson Matthey has a strong presence in Kanpur.

"To foster industrial development, the state govt has implemented over 25 policies aimed at attracting investments across various sectors. A key initiative is the Incentive Policy 2023, designed to draw in
