Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath on Thursday hoisted the national flag in front of Vidhan Bhawan in Lucknow on the occasion of Independence Day and described Uttar Pradesh as a State with unlimited potential while listing out various development works completed by his government.

Mr. Adityanath announced the launch of 'Mukhyamantri Yuva Udyam Vikas Abhiyan Yojana', aimed at empowering the youth. Under the

create employment opportunities for 50 lakh young people in the coming years,” said Mr. Adityanath in his address.
