Lko 3rd among India's cleanest big cities

State capital gets full marks on key parameters such as Garbage-Free City and ODF certification despite civic challenges

LUCKNOW: The state capital Lucknow has secured the third rank among the cleanest cities in the country in the million-plus population category in the Swachh Shahar Awards 2024-25 under the Swachh Survekshan, trailing only Ahmedabad and Bhopal, which bagged the first and second positions respectively.

Lucknow earned full marks on key parameters such as Garbage-Free City and Open Defecation Free certification.

President Droupadi Murmu presented the award during a ceremony at Vigyan Bhavan, New Delhi, on Thursday.

Strong citizen engagement, improved waste segregation, smart sanitation infrastructure, and active public-private partnerships have been key to Lucknow's achievement.

While the state has achieved the third rank in a new category (there was only one category earlier), challenges remain. Issues like waste dumping, poor street continued on →13

Million-plus category: Five UP cities in top 20

LUCKNOW: Two Uttar Pradesh cities ranked in the top 10 and five in the top 20 in the Swachch Shahar Awards (million-plus cities category) under the Swachch Survekshan 2024-25. While Lucknow ranked third, Agra was 10th, Ghaziabad 11th, Prayagraj 12th and Varanasi 17th. In addition, Prayagraj was declared cleanest city in Ganga town category and was honoured with a special national award for the Mahakumbh. Gorakhpur stood out with two major achievements— third in Safai Mitra Surakshit Shahar for sanitation worker safety and fourth among cities in 3-10 lakh category. →P2 Ahmedabad cleanest city →Pm
