Second Edition Of ET Digital UP Conclave Today

Lucknow: In a dynamic push to position Uttar Pradesh as the country's next digital powerhouse, the department of IT and Electronics, in association with ET Government, will hold the second edition of the ET Digital UP Conclave on Friday.

As part of this, Union minister of state for commerce and Industry and IT and Electronics Jitin Prasada and deputy chief minister UP Brajesh Pathak will come together to brainstorm with sectoral experts and stakeholders on using modern technologies to strengthen governance and secure the state in the realm of the digital future.

UP's industries and infrastructure development minister Nand Gopal Gupta Nandi will also address the conclave.

The two milestones are seen as enablers towards the state's larger goal to become a one trillion-dollar economy.
